It has been a privilege to be a member of Taree Old Bar Surf Club in the season of 2018-2019 and it has been an honour to be the President of this club in its 91st Year.

Regrettably, my role as President was not voted on by members at the AGM and instead I was voted onto the Board of Directors, who subsequently installed me in the President Role in late July.
